A Historical Sketch of Immanual Lutheran Church

It is with gratitude to God that we learn of the 75 years of our church in this community. The early pioneers came by water to Whatcom (now Bellingham) by team and wagon north along the Telegraph Road, by ferry across the Nooksack River, about one mile west of Everson, and then afoot or on horseback to the present site of the community of Lawrence.

Two brothers, Ole and S. H. Howem, were among the first settlers to take a homestead in the Lawrence community. They arrived in 1883. In 1884, Ole Helgesen and John Johnson with their families arrived from the East. The community continued to grow until in 1887 Pastor Jorgenson, journeying north from Stanwood, found many souls eager for the Word and Sacrament. It was this work which led in 1891 to the calling of Pastor L. C. Foss, who was serving a congregation in Fairhaven, South Bellingham. The first service at Lawrence was conducted in the J. Johnson home by Pastor Foss on March 15, 1891. His memory will live long in our church as he was so closely linked with its humble beginning.

Marie Tollum was the first baby baptized by Pastor L. C. Foss on March 15, 1891. After her confirmation, Marie was Sunday School teacher and Superintendent and organist for more than 25 years of continuous service.

On January 7, 1892, the first constitution written in Pastor Foss'





handwriting was read and adopted. The same year plans were begun for a church. Pastor Foss was a good carpenter and with the help of C. L. Tolum (who came with his family in 1888) acted as chief carpenter. Though there was little money there were many willing hands and the church was completed and dedicated in 1898.

In 1906 the congregation built a school house to be used for Sunday School, Young People's meetings and choir practice. The site was a half acre north of the railroad track and now occupied by Fullner's Shake Mill. In later years Pastor Borge conducted parochial and public school there for two years.

In 1918 another building project was launched. This time a parsonage was built upon an acre of land given by S. S. Howem, who had also donated the land for the school house. Pastor Borge occupied it in 1919.

In 1924, the statue of Christ, which we now have on the altar was given by the girls Sewing Society, "Pigsforening".

The school house was moved to the church grounds in 1942 to become the parish hall. It was during the Reverend Eggen's pastorate that plans for the present church building were begun and a building fund was established.

In 1946 when the Rev. John Halverson was pastor, definite plans for the new church was completed. On land donated by Henry Halverson and S. O. Howem, ground breaking took place early in 1947. The cornerstone was laid June 22, 1947.

Historical Sketch continued

After many sacrifices, gifts, and valuable hours donated by our members, the beautiful new church was completed. It was dedicated May 23, 1948, fifty years after the dedication of the old church.

In the spring of 1949 the new Hammond electric organ was dedicated.


In the fall of 1949 the congregation made extensive improvements of our cemetery; more land was purchased and some donated by Fred Williams.

At the annual meeting, January 30, 1950, it was voted that we become self-supporting under the leadership of our first full-time pastor, Juston Crary. Previously our pastor had served Ferndale, Custer and Matsqui.

On October 21, 1951, the Congregation and Ladies Aid commenorated 60 years with festival services with Dr. Foss as guest speaker and a Choir Concert in the evening. A cross, candle sticks, and altar cloth given by church members were dedicated.

On May 18, 1953, the mortgage of the church was burned and an offering was received to begin a fund for the building of a new parish house and Sunday School rooms.

Plans for the parish house were completed in 1954, the first year of Pastor Bremer's ministry. Construction began in July and again with many donations of money and time by members and friends. Church pews were purchased and the parish house was completed



and dedicated on October 30, 1955, with Chaplain J. Crary as guest speaker.

In 1959, land for a new parsonage near the church was given by Mrs. John Richardt in memory of her husband and son, Arnold.

The 70th Anniversary of the congregation was observed with much festivity. An Anniversary fellowship banquet on Friday, June 2, 1961, was followed on Sunday with a Festival Service at 11:00 a.m. and an Anniversary Confirmation Reunion at 2:30 p.m. Dr. H. L. Foss, Pastors Judson Crary and Obed Vold were speakers.

In 1963 the congregation ventured forth in a progressive way to serve the community. A Christian Kindergarten began to function in the month of February, 1963, with the purpose to prepare children for school and to teach the basic truths of Christianity. Miss Corinne Erickson was called as our first full time parish worker then. Before her coming, the congregation had only part-time parish workers, Miss Ruth Getz, and Miss Judy Fredrickson, 1961-1962.

A beautiful new parsonage was dedicated by Dr. S. C. Siefkes on January 10, 1965. It was built almost entirely by the members of the congregation on land donated by Mrs. John Richardt. The first pastor's family to occupy it is the Orning Fjelstads, who arrived in August of 1964, Pastor Bremer having left in May of that year.

Immanuel Congregation is most thankful to God for His faithfulness through these 75 years and for His promise to lead us in the future. The growth of the congregation has been gratifying through the years. There are now 436 baptised members. There are 180 students and staff in the Sunday School. Through the 75 years there have been 673 baptisms, 458 confirmations, 226 marriages and 245 funerals.

We thank God for continually providing new opportunities to serve our Lord and community. The congregation is now involved in the Bethel Series Bible Study, hoping to have most of the adults studying the Bible in 1967. There are plans being made for additional building in the very near future. We give credit to the many men, women and children, who in the past have served Christ through the work of this congregation and whose faith and talents have been used by God to produce this congregation and these buildings and this witness to our Lord. We look to Him, our crucified and risen Lord, who promises to be with us until the end and in whom we have found our deepest joy and reason for being.
